



## PUBLICATIONS

IMISCOE has established a number of publication series. This includes book publications as well as journal publications. In terms of book publications, IMISCOE has established an **IMISCOE Research Series** of over 50 books over the past decade. All books are submitted to a rigorous peer-review procedure via the IMISCOE editorial committee. In addition, in the **IMISCOE Textbooks series**, the network provides a platform to publish educational books for use in the training of graduate-level students pursuing migration studies.

Besides book publications, IMISCOE is also involved in journal publications. Since 2014, IMISCOE is associated with the journal **Comparative Migration Studies**, published by Springer. CMS is an international, peer-reviewed journal for comparative research in the field of migration, integration and ethnic studies and provides Open Access to all publications.

A key characteristic of IMISCOE (book and journal) publications is the support of **Open Access publishing**. IMISCOE promotes the widest possible access to the research and publications of IMISCOE members as possible, to promote the dissemination of work and the opportunities for learning from each others research. With current developments in funding schemes like Horizon 2020, and the growing importance of citation indexes like Google Scholar, IMISCOE anticipates that OA

publishing will become the standard in our field. Over the past decade, IMISCOE has established itself as the leading supporter of OA publishing in the field of migration and integration studies. The Journal CMS is an OA journal, and most of the books in the IMISCOE Book Series are available in Open Access.

## EVENTS

Throughout the year numerous IMISCOE events are organised, in the context of research clusters, publication events, PhD training, etc. The most important item on the annual agenda of IMISCOE is the annual conference, which has been organised every year since 2004 by one of IMISCOE's member institutes. These conferences are a key item on the annual agenda of most migration scholars as well as a key moment where members of the IMISCOE network, from all stages of academic career, meet to discuss research and develop joint proposals. The conferences attract on average more than 400 scholars.

Over the last decade, annual IMISCOE conferences have been organized in *Coimbra (2004)*, *Osnabruck (2005)*, *Vienna (2006)*, *Sussex (2007)*, *Bilbao (2008)*, *Stockholm (2009)*, *Liege (2010)*, *Warsaw (2011)*, *Amsterdam (2012)*, *Malmö (2013)*, *Madrid (2014)* and *Geneva (2015)*.

## TRAINING AND AWARDS

Training of young researchers is an essential task of the Network. By pooling the resources and expertise of its partners and members, IMISCOE facilitates the highest quality training for all Network members. To this aim, the Network provides annual winter- or summer schools for PhD's, as well as specific training modules at other IMISCOE events.

Furthermore, the IMISCOE Research Network awards the **Maria Ioannis Baganha Distinguished Dissertation Award** annually (since 2010) to stimulate and recognise excellent PhD research in the field of migration, integration and social cohesion in Europe. As of 2014, IMISCOE also installs the **Rinus Penninx Best Paper Award** in the context of the annual IMISCOE conferences.
